



Progression from New Zealand Diploma of Construction/Arch. Technology to B.Con 2018

Any student that has successfully graduated from a Unitec New Zealand Diploma and wishes to progress to study the Bachelor of Construction is eligible for advanced standing subject to the 2018 Programme Specific Regulations (the following excerpt is from the 2018 Bachelor of Construction Regulations):

3.2 *Transfer from Diploma programmes*

For students from the Level 6 NZ Diploma in Construction (Construction Management and Quantity Surveying) or the NZ Diploma in Architectural Technology the following entry pathways will be available.

- a. For a completed Diploma, in the discipline of a BCons major, a student will be given 210 credits and entry to the programme at a point appropriate to their chosen major.*
- b. For a completed Diploma, in the discipline of a BCons major and completed with above average academic performance, a student will be given 210 credits, plus the opportunity to gain 30 credits via two 15-credit courses (CONS6601 Transition Studies 1 and CONS6602 Transition Studies 2). These 30 credits must be achieved before entry to the third year of the degree.*
- c. For a completed Diploma, together with significant and appropriate industry experience, a student will be given 240 credits and entry to the third year of the degree.*

For transition from other Level 6 diploma programmes in construction and infrastructure areas a similar pattern of credits may be possible; on a discretionary basis. In assessing whether to grant discretionary admission the primary focus will be on the applicant's level of preparedness for study at the required level.

“Above average academic performance” for the 2018 Fall enrolment period will be set at a “B” average. Any student wishing to pursue Track B must enrol in CONS 6598 and 6599 to be held during the summer semester. These are self-study modules and you will be assigned a suitable supervisor for the semester. All assessments will be handed in and grades returned prior to the beginning of Semester 1, 2018. Failure to successfully complete these courses will result in students being directed to Track A.
